I hereby certify that:

1. My 4-H animal has not been maintained at a professional fitter's facility and has been in my continuous ownership since the date indicated in Indiana 4-H Online.
2. The exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or legal guardians agree that they are responsible for the care and custody of their animals in preparation for and while at the Indiana State Fair; including, but not limited to, policies regarding drug use and animal well-being.
3. I am Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Certified.
4. I am responsible for adhering to withdrawal times on all drugs administered to my animal; only giving my animal FDA approved drugs; and keeping my animal free of illegal drugs prior to and during the Indiana State Fair. I also understand that listing any substance on this form that violates the Terms and Conditions does not release me from the penalties associated with the violation.
5. My submission of a 4-H entry expressly binds me to all terms and conditions contained in any and all parts of the Indiana State Fair 4-H Entry Book, to include, but not limited to, consent to drug steroid, tissue tests, examination of my animal's carcass and insertion of a microchip or ear tag for identification as a condition of entering the Indiana State Fair.

1. Affidavit - a written statement of fact which is sworn to as the truth before an authorized officer.
2. (Indiana Code 15-21-21-9)-A person who knowingly or intentionally violates or fails to comply with this article commits a Class D Felony.(6)
3. Perjury - knowingly making a false material statement under oath or affirmation. In Indiana, a person who commits perjury commits a Class D felony(6) which may be punishable by imprisonment, fine or restitution.(Indiana Code 35-44-2-1 and 35-50-2-7).
4. Prosecution for violations of Indiana law will be referred to the proper authorities
5. Oath - An affirmation of truth of a statement before an authorized person.
6. Felony - A crime of graver or more serious nature than those designated as misdemeanors.
